

#### **ELECTRONIC GIVING OPTION NOW AVAILABLE**

Asbury invites you to consider electronic giving as a way to automate your regular giving. Electronic giving offers convenience for individual congregation members and provides much-needed consistency for our congregation. If you are currently giving on a weekly basis, you will no longer need to write out 52 checks a year or prepare 52 envelopes. And, when travel, illness or other circumstances prevent you from attending services, this program will allow your weekly offerings to continue on an uninterrupted basis. This option is being offered through Vanco Services, a Conference-approved provider with a successful history of secure transactions, at no additional cost to you.

We offer two ways to give:

**Online Giving** lets you go to the church website (<a href="www.asburylv.org">www.asburylv.org</a>) to make one-time donations or to set up a schedule of automatic donations. By setting up a password-protected profile, you will be able to log in at any time to make donations, change a recurring donation plan or view your personal giving history.

**Direct Debit Giving** is used to automatically transfer funds from your checking or savings account to the church's bank account. If you are already using direct debit to make mortgage and car payments or to pay utility bills, then you know how it works. Authorization forms for giving by direct debit are available in the church office.

## EXTRAVAGANT GENEROSITY

#### **EXPLORE PROMISE**

"And I say to you, Ask, and it shall be given to you; seek, and you shall find; knock, and it shall be opened to you." (Luke 11:9)

Most of us are good at the first step of prayer. It is easy to ask God to do something! Unfortunately, we think that once we have asked, we are expected to do nothing more. The first step in any journey is critical. We do need to ask in order to receive. But asking is just the first step. It takes many more steps to continue a real journey of prayer.
