

A MINISTRY OF PRESENCE: KEEP IN TOUCH TEAM

The mission of the Keep In Touch Lay Ministry Team is to provide a ministry of presence for Asbury members who are in hospitals or who are confined to their homes or retirement communities, in order to be a living reminder of God's love and to help them stay connected with their church community.

Our ministry team includes 18 members who faithfully visit Asbury members on a monthly basis, either by telephone or in person. Additionally, four team members visit in the hospitals twice a week. We also send cards and notes for birthdays, holidays, and other special occasions to those visited by the Keep In Touch members.

We are grateful to Rev. Dr. Glenn Asquith who has been our advisor, mentor and leader. He has offered training and answered many questions as we constantly seek creative and caring ways to provide spiritual care and assistance to the Asbury community in times of illness, rehabilitation, or confinement. We have valued his counseling and thank him as he completes his pastoral care ministry at Asbury effective January 1.

If you have a relative living in this area or who is hospitalized locally and not connected to a local congregation, we will be happy to visit that relative. If you know of someone in the congregation needing monthly visits, please contact us.
