Knowing your forever can shape your today. The questions we have about life after death—Is there a heaven? Am I good enough? What if I'm not? — can leave us wondering. But that doesn't mean we have to live in fear. Our understanding of life after death could change everything.

## Monday: 2 Corinthians 5:1-10

In this passage of scripture, the Apostle Paul is telling the people in the church in Corinth about physical bodies and eternal glory. What does this scripture passage say about how we should live our lives?

### **Tuesday: Hebrews 9:27-28**

People have many different beliefs regarding life after death. In Christianity, scripture passages like this one and several others remind us that immediately after death our physical bodies die, our soul separates from the body and we will face judgment. What did you grow up believing about life after death? Has it changed as an adult?

#### Thursday: 2 Corinthians 5:10

This is a judgment for those who are followers of Christ, your sins were judged and forgiven by Jesus. This is a place where if Jesus acknowledges us, what you did on earth is rewarded in heaven. What are some things you'd love to be known for when you meet Jesus in Heaven?

#### Friday: I Peter 1:17

In this passage, Peter is reminding us that this world is not our home. We are just passing through. This is just a short period of time in the eternal scheme of things. How do you already live like eternity matters? Are there any ways you're living like it doesn't?
