8 But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us.



#### INTRODUCTION

We all wonder. When we fix our eyes somewhere other than on God, wonder leads to wander. If you wandered from the faith or are looking for the door, it's not because of Jesus. It's probably because you fixed your eyes on people, institutions, or a religion based on following rules. You may think Christianity requires mind-numbing experience denying faith, but what if that's not true.

If you wondered, then wandered, here is something to ponder: there will always be things about faith that make you wonder, but God's love for you should not be one of them. Two thousand years ago, light broke through the darkness in the town of Bethlehem. God communicated in no uncertain terms that he loves you. So take your eyes off the people, the institutions, the legalism that caused you to lose faith and fix your eyes on Jesus. Fix your eyes on the wonder of his love.

- 5) During the message, Eric said "There will always be things about faith that make you wonder, but God's love for you should not be one of them." Do you agree or disagree with this statement? Why or why not?
